



COVID Catch up Premium plan for expenditure

Background

The government is providing funding to cover a one-off universal catch-up premium for the 2020 to 2021 academic year.

Schools will receive a total of **£80 per pupil** (for reception through to year 11), as follows:

- In 3 instalments - in autumn 2020, 'early 2021' and summer 2021
- You'll get a total of £46.67 per pupil across payments 1 and 2
- You'll get £33.33 per pupil for payment 3

Finham Park 2 will therefore receive approx. £48000 to support students in catching up.

- **Which pupils need to access the support** - although you'll receive funding on a per pupil basis, there are no specific requirements for who to spend it on. Identify pupils that will benefit most from the funding - see our [article](#) to find out which pupil groups this may include
- **The activities that you'll provide** - the DfE recommends the following:
 - Small group or 1-to-1 tuition (particularly through the National Tutoring Programme - see the section below for details)
 - Summer programmes to help re-engage pupils or extra teaching capacity from September

<p>National Tutoring programme - High Quality 1-2-1 or small group tuition – evidence indicates that small group and 1-2-1 interventions can be a powerful tool for supporting students.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Register interest with the National Tutoring Programme • Once students identified as requiring catch up tutoring is completed a plan of when and how the tuition programme will be delivered to be completed. • A list of approved Tuition Partners, organised by region, will be available on the NTP website at the end of October.
